# COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is designed for teaching staff and aspiring educational leaders to understand the critical role of good leadership in schools and develop effective conflict management skills. The course explores the benchmark for good leadership in schools, providing insights into driving lasting and sustainable change. Participants will learn how leading by example can enhance teaching capacity across the entire school.

Additionally, the program acknowledges that conflicts are inevitable in any school environment due to the dynamic nature of interpersonal relationships. It delves into the understanding that schools serve as micro-level societies, where conflicts arise based on hierarchical positions. Participants will be equipped with **strategies to comprehend and manage conflicts effectively**, ensuring they do not negatively impact the teaching and learning process.

- **Application to Classroom Learning Environments:** Understand the relevance of conflict management skills specifically in the context of the school precinct and classroom, ensuring a positive impact on the teaching and learning process.
- **Develop communication and social skills in English.**
- **Share best practices with teachers from other countries, cultures and backgrounds.**
